

PCA Program Overview

- Priority Conservation Areas (PCAs) are locally nominated locations important for protecting and enhancing the region's natural and agricultural lands and improving outdoor access and urban greening in Bay Area communities
- The **PCA planning framework** was first designed in 2007, had minor updates in 2014, and recently underwent a data-driven **Refresh**
 - Estuary Blueprint Task 3-5
- PCAs designations make projects eligible for PCA
 Grant Program funding







Prior PCA Grant Cycles

- MTC and Coastal Conservancy have awarded over \$30 million in support of 58 projects
- Eligible project types have included:
 - Protection of natural resources, open space, or agricultural lands
 - Habitat restoration or enhancements
 - Trail and access improvements
 - Urban greening
 - Planning activities
- Two separately managed programs:
 - North Bay (CTAs)
 - Rest of Bay (MTC/SCC)








Two Phase Approach

- Phase 1 \$8.5M (2024)
 - Support near-term need for conservation project funding
 - Largely maintain 2019 PCA Grant Program Guidelines
 - Target 50+% of funding in North Bay counties
- Phase 2 \$8M (Spring 2025)
 - Implement PCA Refresh framework
 - Seek SCC supplemental funding







PCA Grant Program Process

- December 8 Committee approval to release \$8.5M Call for Proposals
- March 11 Grant Program Guidelines and Call for Proposals released
- May 8 24 LOIs received (\$21.2M)
- June 6 15 proposals advanced
- August 28 Full applications due
- November 8 13 award recommendations

- Evaluation criteria
 - Alignment with PCA Goals
 - Partnership / EPC benefits
 - Regional Significance
 - Likelihood of Success
 - Multiple Benefits
 - Operations and Maintenance

- Full award for projects >85pts (7)
- 75% award for projects 84-76 pts (6)
- No award for projects <75pts (2)


